

# Plastic Bag Free Thornbury



Today's society currently consumes plastic bags at a rate of **1.2 trillion bags annually**—more than **1 million per minute**.

On average we use each plastic bag for approximately 12 minutes before disposing. It lasts in the environment for decades.

#### Fast facts:

- It takes 1 second to produce a plastic bag
- It takes 500 to 1000 years for a plastic bag to degrade
- 100,000 tonnes of plastic bags are thrown away in the UK each year
- 100,000 marine animals and birds are killed each year by plastic bags





Plastic bags, as with all forms of plastic, do not biodegrade –they break down into smaller toxic parts contaminating soil, waterways and oceans. For marine life, plastic bag litter is lethal, killing at least 100,000 birds, whales, seals and turtles every year. After an animal is killed by plastic bags, its body decomposes and the plastic is released back into the environment where it can kill again.

Sustainable Thornbury - a community group whose aim is to preserve and develop a sustainable local economy for Thornbury — is asking local traders to join them in their bid to reduce plastic bags in the town.

Do your bit for Thornbury and help your local environment by reducing the number of plastic bags you hand out in your shop.

**Thornbury Chamber of Commerce** and **Thornbury Town Council** support the initiative to reduce the number of plastic carrier bags given to customers at local shops.
