Charity shops, School fetes, charity toy sales

Clever ideas about reusing items

A4 paper from junk mail — (if plain on one side and preferably unfolded) — use to print on.

Buttons from old torn clothes – sew on other clothes to change their design

Cardboard boxes – add, in proportion with kitchen waste, to compost bins

Catering sized coffee tins with smooth (blunt) tops — decorate to use as small rubbish bins or make a drum.

Clear plastic containers – seedling propagation covers. May help prevent slug attack

Deep lids from hairspray – make small table containers for cut or dried flower arrangements.

Fabric cut from bottom of long skirts etc. – use to make a matching bag.

Food jars with screw tops – Can be used as storage for dried rice, dried herbs, currants etc.

Greetings cards – cut up and use to design your own cards

Jam jars with lids — Give to people who make jam or marmalade. Or remove label and then use to store cosmetic items, cotton wool etc. (Keep out of children's' reach & sight)

Large polystyrene packaging box – fill with dried grass to make a Hay box (slow cooker)

Old bucket - Outer cover for plant pot

Old Tee shirts – Remodel – e.g. Cut off torn necks and add lace. Or cut up to make cleaning and washing up cloths

Plain paper from junk mail – use as shopping list, phone messages pads etc.

Plain plastic containers e.g. Ice cream box – cut with care to make plant seed labels

Removable decorations, bows etc from greetings cards and presents — Use to decorate your own cards (or clothes if made from fabric ribbon).

Small plain boxes – decorate to use as a wrapping for a small gift.
